Drone Proposal

The Chippewa Falls Police Department has been researching drones as a public safety tool. As part of this research we believe that the Maverick Drone Systems product matches our needs at a reasonable cost. This the same system used by some other police agencies in our area and the school district. Maverick Drone Systems came to the department this year on June 30th and explained their products and we flew two different drones. Below are costs associated with what we believe to be the best fit for what our department is looking for in a drone to do to assist with public safety.

The primary reason of interest in obtaining a drone is preservation of life. Use of a drone could be the determining factor in finding someone safely who has walked away from a home due to dementia or other mental illness. The requested drone also has thermal imaging which will assist during cold weather searches when time is critical. The ability of a drone to scan a large area overhead adds a new capability for police & fire.

Rescue Services

- ✓ Efficiently scan vast areas and pinpoint missing individuals with high-resolution digital and thermal cameras
- ✓ Direct and monitor search teams and assets

Firefighting and HazMat

- ✓ Overhead view of developing fire scene
- ✓ Identification of hot spots through smoke during a fire and after the fire is knocked down
- ✓ Safe entry into Hazardous Materials areas such as crashes, derailments or spills

Law Enforcement

- √ Rapidly and safely map, document, and preserve crime scenes, vehicle collisions, and more
- ✓ Help eliminate exposing officers to unnecessary risk by remotely checking hidden areas and blind spots
- ✓ Provide real-time overhead view for mission planning and remote observation

Inspection

- ✓ Allows safe inspection of elevated areas such as on buildings, water towers, forestry, etc.

Training

In order to operate a drone for Law Enforcement use, drone operators must be "Part 107 certified" through the Federal Aviation Administration. This includes a test that must be taken at a designated testing center. Drone operators are recertified every two years. There is no cost for the recertification.

The cost to take the test is \$173.00 per person. Maverick Drone Systems offers live virtual training to prepare Officers to take the test. The cost is \$199.00 per person.

Officer Brian Flug is already certified as a drone operator. A minimum of three additional operators would be recommended to be trained so the drone has a pilot when needed. More pilots would be added as needed and as funding becomes available.

- \$199 Virtual Drone Training Class from Maverick Done Systems
- \$173 Part 107 FAA Drone Operator Certification Test

Total cost per additional operator is \$372.

DJI Mini 2 Drone - Optional

This is a smaller easily field deployable drone that could be used on patrol anytime an officer is in a position to visually check an area without exposing themselves to danger. It could also be used to supplement the larger drone during battery changes or to expand a search area.

- 12 MP Visual camera with 2x-4x Zoom
- 31 minute flight time per battery
- Propeller guard for indoor flying
- Operating using smart phones already in squad cars

Total cost \$618.99 per drone

CITY OF CHIPPEWA FALLS APPLICABLE OFFENSE CRITERIA FOR OPERATOR (BARTENDER) LICENSE APPLICATION/RENEWAL

The applicant may be denied if:

1. The applicant has been convicted of two (2) applicable offenses within thirty-six (36) months of the filing of the application;

AND

One (1) of the above convictions must have been committed within twelve (12) months of the date of application.

- 2. The applicant has been convicted of any one of the following offenses within thirty-six (36) months of the filing of the application: Obstructing/Resisting an Officer, Battery, Delivery of a Controlled Substance, or Maintaining a Drug House.
- 3. The applicant has been convicted of a felony that is substantially related to the licensed activity within 10 years of filing the application.
- 4. The applicant has ever been convicted or has a pending charge of an "Exempt Offense" or a "Violent Crime Against a Child" as defined by WI State Statute 111.335.
