- 2. The Board of Public Works considered election of a Vice-President for 2021-2022. Mayor Hoffman nominated Tom Hubbard.

# CITY OF CHIPPEWA FALLS BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, JUNE 7, 2021 – 5:30 PM

The Board of Public Works met in City Hall on Monday, June 7, 2021 at 5:30 PM. Attending were Mayor Greg Hoffman, Finance Manager Lynne Bauer, Alderperson Hayden Frey and Tom Hubbard. Also attending was Senior Engineering Technician Todd Berg. Director of Public Works Rick Rubenzer P.E. was absent.

- 1. <u>Motion</u> by Hubbard, seconded by Bauer to approve the minutes of the May 24, 2021 Board of Public Works meeting. All present voting aye. <u>MOTION CARRIED.</u>
- 2. The Board of Public Works considered the attached 2020 Compliance Maintenance Annual Report and corresponding resolution. Senior Engineering Technician Berg gave a summary of the Compliance Maintenance Annual Report and the issues that made the Compliance Maintenance Resolution necessary and the need to submit the Compliance Maintenance Resolution with the report by the June deadline. There was a brief discussion about what might be causing the elevated BOD loading.

  Motion by Hubbard, seconded by Frey to recommend the Common Council to approve the Compliance Maintenance Resolution. All present voting aye. MOTION

  CARRIED.
- The Board of Public Works considered the Street Light Agreement with Xcel Energy for a street light at the Division Street/Grand Avenue/Front Street area. Senior Engineering Technician Berg provided a map of the area showing the existing street lights in the area along with possible locations for a new light. Berg explained the reason for adding a street light in the area is because of vehicles failing to make the curve on Grand Avenue/Division Street between Front Street and Therbrook Street. Mayor Hoffman inquired as to how many accidents at that location and would like that accident reports to be forwarded to the Common Council. After discussion, the Board of Public Works determined the best location for an additional street light would be the northeast corner of Division Street and Front Street, just west of the concrete island. Mayor Hoffman and Frey also stated that lights could be added in the future to the existing poles at the southeast corner of Grand Avenue and Front Street and along the west side of Division Street near the alley north of Front Street. Berg indicated that the agreement doesn't have an exact dollar amount at this time, but would likely be similar to the cost (\$2,270), of the street light located at Cashman Drive and Seymour Cray Sr. Boulevard. Motion by Hoffman seconded by Frey to recommend the Common Council approve the agreement with Xcel Energy for a 65 W LED street light at the northeast corner of Front Street and Division Street. All present voting aye. MOTION CARRIED.



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# MEETING MINUTES CITY OF CHIPPEWA FALLS MINUTES OF THE GROUNDWATER TECHNICAL REVIEW COMMITTEE Tuesday, June 22, 2021, 1:00 PM Council Chambers, Chippewa Falls City Hall

The Groundwater Technical Review Committee met in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, June 22, 2021 at 1:00 PM. Present were: Director of Public Works/City Engineer/Utilities Manager Rick Rubenzer, PE, City Inspector/Zoning Administrator Paul Lasiewicz, Water Supervisor Matt Boos, City Planner Brad Hentschel, AICP (voting members); Mitch Banach, PG and Dan Masterpole (advisory members). Also attending: Ethan Henderson, AMS Energy Ventures.

1. Approve Minutes of the October 19, 2018 Groundwater Technical Review Committee Meeting.

Motion by Lasiewicz, seconded by Rubenzer to approve the minutes of the October 19, 2018 Groundwater Technical Review Committee meeting. **All present voting aye. Motion carried.** 

2. Discuss/Consider possible reclassification of a "Prohibited Use" to "Provisional" under Chapter 19 of City of Chippewa Falls Municipal Code, Wellhead Protection. Possible recommendation to the Chippewa Falls Board of Public Works (Attachments).

The Committee reviewed a presentation by Mr. Henderson regarding a proposal for an above-ground possible retail fueling system and possible applicability to the City's Wellhead Protection code. AMS will pursue partnering with a convenience store operator. Fuel sales would be above-ground in a double-walled tank. Would likely do two products (likely unleaded and diesel). Tank refilling occurs through double-locked containers, with a 50-gallon drip pan for collection of any accident spills. Tank is "portable" in that it can be un-bolted from the concrete foundation and relocated offsite if problems are encountered. Proposed site would also incorporate Blink EV charging stations as well.

Fueling area would be over concrete pad under a fixed canopy. Concrete pad area would be surrounded by a French drain system with oil/water separation that would drain into a below ground double-walled tank with moisture detection. Overflow of this under-ground tank would be connected to sanitary sewer system only in the case of extreme condition. Monitoring is performed remotely. Fueling operator would also work with C-store operator to provide in-person daily monitoring. All operations would be in compliance with a Spill Prevention, Control and Countermeasure plan.

Advisory members indicated that considered site is on the edge of the wellhead protection district but is within parameters of regulation. Likely largest risk would be in the case of natural disaster. Detection measures are available for possible use beyond French drain system to notify if there are any residual petroleum products extending beyond containment areas. Committee concerns remained about this being an unnecessary risk within the wellhead protection area that if control mechanisms would

fail, could impact water supply. Some level of risk will always be present with vehicles traveling throughout the wellhead protection area.

Committee determined that due to tank being above-ground proposed use would be appropriate for Provisional Use permit consideration. Applicant was advised to compile a full-application on the entire build-out use of the site, including the convenience store operator, who would also be able to provide information on additional regulated substances for sale or use within the c-store, and how those materials are contained and prevented from potential off-site migration. Full design on safety and mitigation measures will be needed along with all application materials for a provisional use permit application for further review and consideration. **No action taken.** 

# 3. Adjournment

Motion by Lasiewicz, seconded by Boos to adjourn. All present voting aye. Motion carried.
